



The Kentucky September 11th Memorial is located at the Kentucky Veterans Cemetery Central in Radcliff, Kentucky. The Memorial is dedicated to those that lost their lives on that fateful day as well as military service-members who gave their all in the War on Terror overseas since. The Memorial is comprised of a 16 foot beam from the World Trade Center mounted atop a 6 foot granite column together towering 22 feet and weighing over 9 tons. The back wall is constructed of Pentagon Limestone blocks recovered from the Pentagon after the attack. To each side there are black granite walls containing images of that fateful day as well all the names of Kentucky service-members that gave their lives overseas in the war against terrorism. Built through the volunteer efforts of the community over a five year period, this effort was a patriotic mission of many volunteers being military veterans themselves. The Memorial represents the greatness of this nation as it and its people persist through one its most trying times.

In 2013, the Kentucky House of Representatives in House Resolution 103 recognized the Kentucky September 11th Memorial as the first officially recognized Memorial in Kentucky to that tragic day.
